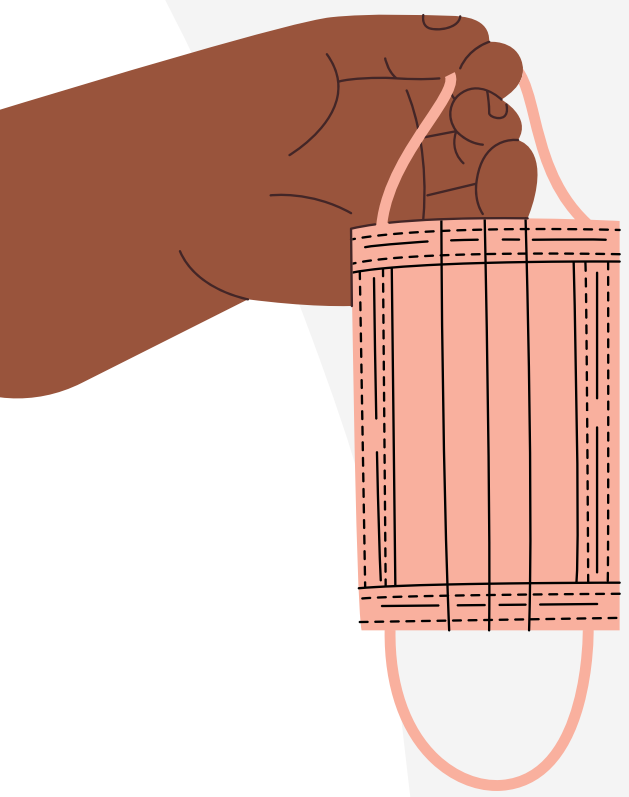
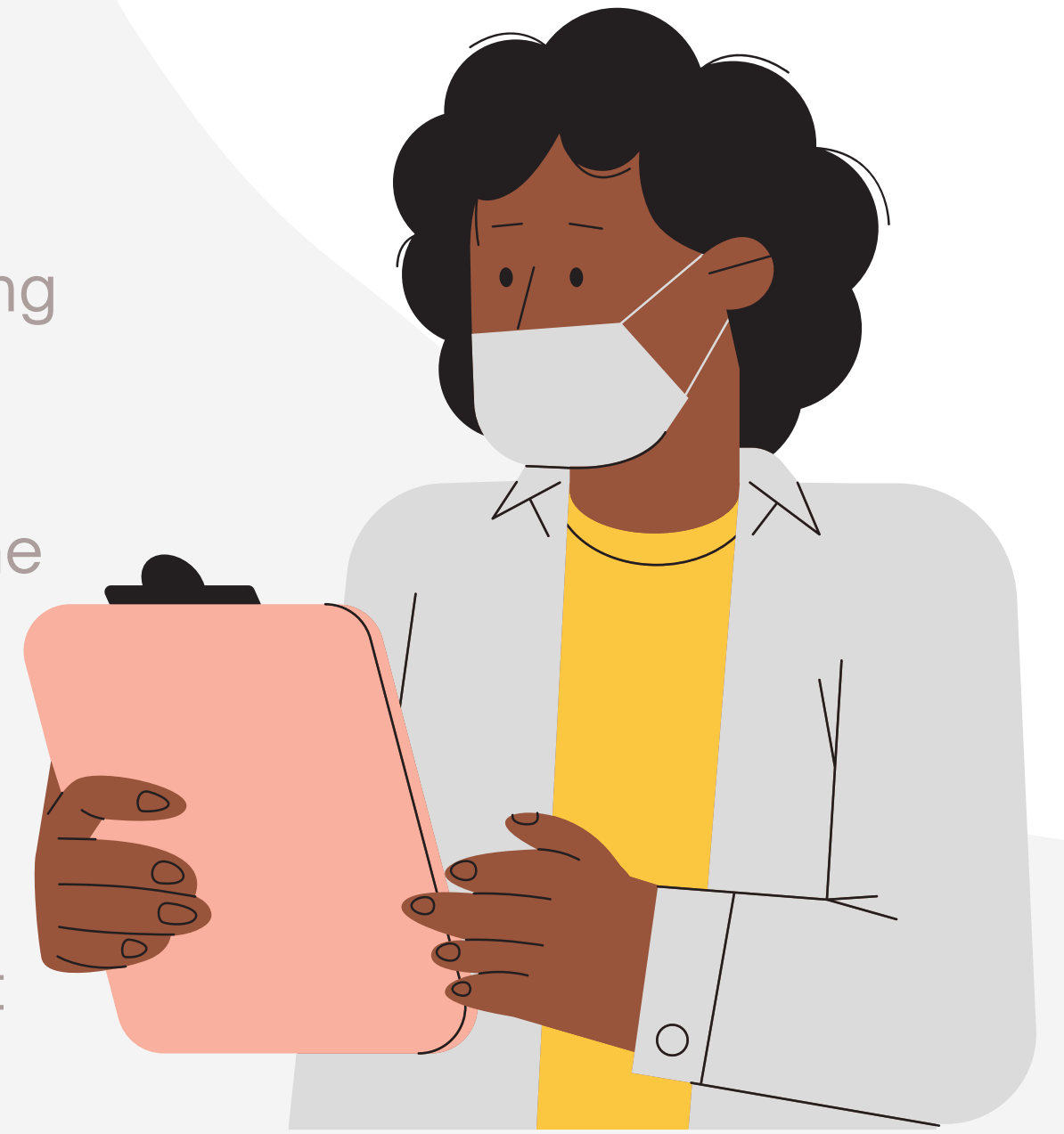


# A CONVERSATION ABOUT THE COVID-19 VACCINE
