What is PAACT?

Convened by GEEARS: Georgia Early Education Alliance for Ready Students, PAACT: Promise All Atlanta Children Thrive is a city-wide alliance of public and private partners collaborating to improve learning, health, and well-being outcomes for Atlanta's youngest children and their families.

PAACT's Vision

Families in the City of Atlanta have what they need to ensure that all children starting at birth are healthy, learning and developing so that they enter school ready for success, thrive once in school, and are prepared to reach their full potential as residents of our city.



The Mayor's PAACT Commitment

\$20 Million to Strengthen Atlanta's Early Education Landscape

What we're doing

The City of Atlanta, private foundations, business leaders, and philanthropists are making a historic \$20 million investment in early childhood education. PAACT is collaborating with implementation partners to increase equitable access to high-quality early learning environments across Atlanta.

The Mayor's PAACT Commitment will feature a targeted approach to three of the eight PAACT recommendations to strengthen Atlanta's early childhood landscape.





The Mayor's PAACT Commitment



As part of the Mayor's commitment to PAACT and early childhood education, he proposed a \$20M investment from public and private partners to execute a coordinated strategy among implementation partners to increase access to high-quality, language-rich, early learning environments across City of Atlanta neighborhoods through a targeted three-part investment strategy.

Child Care Quality and Capacity Building

Child Care Affordability and Access

ECE Workforce Recruitment & Retention

- Fund grants for repairs and renovations, professional development, and capacity building support
- Provide child care scholarships for the children of critical employees (for example APS employees)
- Supplement power payments w/ incentives and free professional development

PAACT Repair and Renovation Grant

- ☐ Grants up to \$75,000
 - ☐ Funding will be determined based on project scopes and costs, and include contingencies
- Between 40-60 grants anticipated to be disbursed depending on project budgets and scopes
- → Projects designed to improve and augment your current space to address health and safety concerns and/or enhance the learning environment
 - ☐ Additions/expansions will not be considered
- Providers will have the option to partner with Quality Care for Children for business coaching and other technical supports

Eligibility



In order to be eligible for the PAACT Repair and Renovation Grant, you must:

- 1. Serve children from 0 to 4 years old
- Be located in the City of Atlanta
- Participate in Quality Rated
- Accept families who are low income (e.g. CAPS, Early Head Start, BOOST)

Sample Project Ideas

- "The paint in many of my rooms is peeling and I have a leak in my roof."
- "My fridge is always on the fritz and my kitchen makes meal preparation and storage a challenge I need to make a change"
- "I want to reconfigure a storage space into a classroom I want to remove some cabinetry and add a door."
- "My outdoor playspace has limited equipment and I'd like to add a play structure."
- "My licensing consultant said that I really need to address ..."



Sample Project Ideas

- Add or repair fencing around your property to provide a safe outdoor playspace for children
- Replace broken or inefficient kitchen equipment such as a refrigerator or stove, which will improve workspace and food prep.
- Repair broken or inefficient bathroom fixtures that serve children or staff.
- Upgrade air conditioning or heating to provide better indoor air quality for children and staff.
- Repair a condition in your facility that has been flagged as an issue



Overview of the Application Process

Initial Application Released: June 2023

Application Deadline & Scoring: Summer - Fall 2023

Provisionally Successful Applicants Are Assigned a Program Officer (either RF or LIIF): *Fall - Winter 2023*

Applicants Work on Final Application with their Program Officer and Submit for Final Approval: *Fall - Winter 2023*

Final Grants are Awarded and Work Commences: Winter 2023 - Spring 2024

Eligibility and Intake

Welcome to the application for the PAACT Repair and Renovation Grant. This grant, which will enable child care providers to repair, spruce up, or add on to their facilities, is administered by a citywide alliance led by GEEARS: Georgia Early Education Alliance for Ready Promise All Atlanta Children Thrive, the City of Atlanta, Reinvestment Fund, and Low Income Investment Fund (LIIF). Students Our General the Community Foundation for Greater Atlanta. These organizations have joined forces to support Atlanta's early care ns by providing funding and technical support to improve the quality of their facilities.

Renovation Grant is a grant, not a loan, and no recipients will be required to pay the money back.

incation process works:

as first step, you'll take about thirty minutes to fill out an initial online application to see if you are eligible for the PAACT grant and describe your potential project. These applications will then be scored and ranked.

2. If your application is selected to move forward, we will work with you to provide technical assistance for your final application. Our implementation partners will help you define and plan your project, identify a contractor, and solicits bids. Applicants do not need to have any grant-writing, project management, or construction experience.

Eligibility Requirements

To qualify for the PAACT Repair and Renovation Grant, your child care program must:

- . Be located in the City of Atlanta
- Be a Quality Rated program participant
- Serve children ages zero to four
- Serve low-income families

Qualifying applications will be scored based on the potential impact and feasibility of their project, the needs of the community they serve, and the services provided by the program. Initial Review and Scoring Process

- ☐ Initial grant applications will be assessed by a team of reviewers
- Provider eligibility will be confirmed
- Initial applications will be scored based on:
 - Community need
 - Program strengths and offerings
 - Viability of proposed projects
 - ☐ Impact of proposed projects
- → Provisionally successful applicants will then be granted access to the next step in the grant application and paired with their Program Officer
- Once providers have submitted all relevant documentation (incl. 2 contractor bids) and finalized the scope of works for their projects, applications will be reviewed and final grant awards will be made

- Refine your project and scope of work
- Support you through the process of getting bids and selecting a contractor
- Assist in monitor project progress and completion
- Help troubleshoot and thought partner

If Provisionally Awarded:

If Selected:

 Grantees will work with QCC to complete a baseline business assessment, with the option to engage in a full business coaching cycle.



Frequently Asked Questions

Am I eligible if I received/applied for a DECAL Health and Safety Grant?

Yes, the PAACT Repair and Renovation grant is not connected to DECAL's Health and Safety Grant. The funding stream for PAACT is different.

Am I eligible if I received/applied for a FIP grant with ELPM?

Yes, although new applicants may be prioritized.

I just finished a repair. Can I use this funding to reimburse my expenses?

Unfortunately, reimbursements for work already completed or in progress is not allowable.

Do I need my DECAL consultant's permission to apply?

No, although you are welcome to let them know of your plans. DECAL is aware and supportive of this project. For any projects that may impact licensing or capacity or require an amendment, please do reach out.

Frequently Asked Questions

Can I use this funding to expand my center/program?

The purpose of this grant is not center expansion. However, you can use this grant to reconfigure existing space that allows you to serve additional children.

My program is up for reassessment for Quality Rated - am I still eligible? Yes, your program is still eligible to apply for the grant.

Do the repairs and renovations have to be completed within a certain timeframe?


Yes. Projects are intended to be completed by the summer of 2024, though some may be extended on a case-by-case basis.
